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4. PROPER EATING, TASTING, DRINKING OR TOBACCO USE

POINTS

Inspector Comments: Employees shall not eat, drink, or use tobacco in any food-related area where contamination may result.

Violation Description: No employees shall eat, drink, or smoke in any work area. (113977)

6. ADEQUATE HANDWASHING FACILITIES SUPPLIED & ACCESSIBLE

POINTS

Inspector Comments: Employees are to properly wash hands when gloves are changed. Soap and paper towels (or drying device) shall be provided in approved dispensers.

Violation Description: Adequate facilities exclusively for handwashing shall be provided in food preparation areas and within toilet rooms. Handwashing soap, and towels or drying device, shall be provided in dispensers. Handwashing facilities shall be clean, unobstructed, and accessible at all times for employee use. (113953, 113953.1, 113953.2, 114067(f), 114143 (e))

7. PROPER HOT & COLD HOLDING TEMPERATURES

POINTS

Inspector Comments: Potentially hazardous foods shall be held at or below 41°F or at or above 135°F.

Observed 2 door reach in at 58. Impounded till fixed.

Violation Description: Potentially hazardous food shall be held at or below 41°F / 45°F or at or above 135°F. Potentially hazardous food removed from proper holding temperature during preparation must be returned to proper temperature within 2 hours. Potentially hazardous food shall be received at proper temperature without evidence of temperature abuse. (113996, 113998, 114037)

9. PROPER COOLING METHODS

POINTS

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Inspector Comments: All potentially hazardous food shall be RAPIDLY cooled from 135°F to 70°F, within 2 hours, and then from 70°F to 41°F, within 4 hours. Cooling shall be by one or more of the following methods: in shallow containers; separating food into smaller portions; adding ice as an ingredient; using an ice bath, stirring frequently; using rapid cooling equipment; or using containers that facilitate heat transfer.

Observed beans cooled in large pot. Cool in smaller pans.

Violation Description: All potentially hazardous food shall be rapidly cooled from 135°F to 70°F within 2 hours, and then from 70°F to 41°F, within 4 hours. Cooling shall be by one or more of the following methods: in shallow containers; separating food into smaller portions; adding ice as an ingredient; using an ice bath, stirring frequently; using rapid cooling equipment; or, using containers that facilitate heat transfer. (114002, 114002.1)

13. FOOD: UNADULTERATED, NO SPOILAGE, NO CONTAMINATION

POINTS

Inspector Comments: All food shall be manufactured, produced, prepared, compounded, packed, stored, transported, kept for sale, and served so as to be pure, free from adulteration and spoilage.

All food contact surfaces shall be properly washed, rinsed, sanitized, and air dried.

Food contact surfaces shall be properly sanitized using one of the following methods: 100ppm chlorine for 30 seconds; 200ppm quaternary ammonia for 60 seconds; or 25ppm iodine for 60 seconds.

Violation Description: All food shall be manufactured, produced, prepared, compounded, packed, stored, transported, kept for sale, and served to be pure and free from adulteration, spoilage, and contamination. Food shall be fully fit for human consumption. (113967, 113976, 113980, 113982, 113988, 113990, 114035, 114254.3)

31. ADEQUATE FOOD STORAGE; FOOD STORAGE CONTAINERS IDENTIFIED

POINTS

Inspector Comments: All food shall be stored, prepared, displayed or held so that it is protected from contamination.

Unpackaged food shall be displayed and dispensed in a manner that protects the food from contamination.

Food shall be properly labeled and honesty presented.

Store any open bags of food in labeled container.

Keep all food in walk ins on shelves not on floor.

Cover all open foods in walk ins.

Violation Description: Food shall be stored in approved containers and labeled as to contents. Food shall be stored at least 6" above the floor on approved shelving. (114047, 114049, 114051, 114053, 114055, 114067(h), 114069(b))

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34. UTENSILS AND EQUIPMENT APPROVED, GOOD REPAIR

POINTS

Inspector Comments: Walk in freezer has condensation leak and requires repair.

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Violation Description: All utensils and equipment shall be approved and in good repair. (114130, 114130.1-114130.6, 114132, 114133, 114137, 114177, 114257)

35. WAREWASHING; INSTALLED, MAINTAINED. PROPER USE, TEST MATERIALS

POINTS

Inspector Comments: Testing equipment and materials shall be provided to measure the applicable sanitization method.



Violation Description: Food facilities that prepare food shall have approved warewashing equipment. Testing equipment and materials shall be provided to measure the wash water temperature and applicable sanitization method. (114067(g), 114099, 114099.3, 114099.5, 114101(a), 114101.1, 114101.2, 114103, 114107, 114125)

37. EQUIPMENT, UTENSILS, LINENS: STORAGE AND USE

POINTS

Inspector Comments: All equipment and utensils shall be kept clean and free of an accumulation of dust, dirt, food residue, and other debris

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Utensils and equipment shall be handled and stored in an approved manner and protected from contamination. Pressurized cylinders must be securely fastened to a rigid structure.

Violation Description: Utensils and equipment shall be handled and stored in an approved manner, protected from contamination. All

clean and soiled linen shall be properly stored. (114067(h), 114074, 114081, 114083, 114119, 114121, 114143(a-b), 114161, 114172, 114178, 114179, 114185.1, 114185.2, 114185.3, 114185.4, 114185.5)

38. ADEQUATE VENTILATION & LIGHTING: DESIGNATED AREAS; USE

POINTS

Inspector Comments: All areas shall have sufficient ventilation.

Observed 100 degree heat in kitchen air flow.

Provide cooler environment to work.

Violation Description: Mechanical exhaust ventilation shall be provided to remove toxic gases, heat, grease, vapors, and smoke. All areas of a food facility shall have sufficient ventilation to facilitate proper food storage and provide a reasonable condition of comfort for each employee. Toilet rooms shall be vented to the outside air by a screened openable window, an air shaft, or a light-switch activated exhaust fan. Adequate lighting shall be provided in all areas to facilitate cleaning and inspection. Light fixtures in areas where open food is stored, served, prepared, and where utensils are washed shall be of shatterproof construction or protected with light shields. (114149, 114149.1, 114149.2, 114149.3, 114252, 114252.1)

40. WIPING CLOTHS: PROPERLY USED AND STORED

POINTS

Inspector Comments: Wiping cloths used to wipe food-contact surfaces shall be used only once unless stored in an approved sanitizer solution.

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Violation Description: Wiping cloths used to clean food spills shall be used only once, unless stored in an approved concentration of sanitizer solution and laundered daily. (114135, 114185.1, 114185.3(d-e))

43. TOILET FACILITIES: PROPERLY CONSTRUCTED, SUPPLIED, CLEANED

POINTS

Inspector Comments: Toilet tissue and paper towels shall be provided in a permanently installed dispenser at each toilet.

Violation Description: Toilet facilities shall be maintained clean, sanitary, and in good repair. Toilet rooms shall be separated by a well-fitting self-closing door. Toilet tissue shall be provided in a permanently installed dispenser at each toilet. Toilet facilities shall be provided for patrons in establishments with more than 20,000 sq. ft. and in establishments offering on-site consumption. (114250, 114250.1, 114276)

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45. FLOORS, WALLS, CEILING: GOOD REPAIR / FULLY ENCLOSED

POINTS

Inspector Comments: The premises of each food facility shall be maintained clean and free of all items not necessary to the operation of the facility.

The floors, walls, ceilings of a food facility shall be an approved type, have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, and washable surfaces, and shall be maintained in good repair.

Observed unfinished wall in facility. Finish wall to clean and washable surface.

Violation Description: The floors, walls, ceilings finishes must be of an approved material, durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, and easily cleanable. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. (114143 (d), 114257, 114266, 114268, 114271, 114272)

46. FLOORS, WALLS, AND CEILINGS: CLEAN

POINTS

Inspector Comments: The floors, walls, ceilings of a food facility shall be maintained clean.

Violation Description: Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be maintained clean. (114257, 114268.1)

47. NO UNAPPROVED PRIVATE HOMES/LIVING OR SLEEPING QUARTERS

POINTS

Inspector Comments: An area directly opening into a room used as living or sleeping quarters shall not be used for conducting food facility operations.

No sleeping accommodations shall be in any room where food is prepared, stored or sold.

Violation Description: No sleeping accommodations shall be maintained or stored in any room where food is prepared, stored, or sold. (114285, 114286)

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REASONS FOR IMMEDIATE CLOSURE OF A FOOD FACILITY

Per California Health and Safety Code Section 114409 (a):

"If any imminent health hazard is found, unless the hazard is immediately corrected, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed."

A food facility may be closed for any of the following reasons:

- · Overflowing sewage (inside or outside the facility)
- · No potable water
- · No hot water
- · No electricity
- · Rodent or insect infestation
- Any other conditions at the facility that may create an imminent public health risk

In addition to the reasons above, Per California Heath and Safety Code Section 114411:

"The enforcement agency may, after providing opportunity for a hearing, modify, suspend, or revoke a permit for serious or repeated violations of any requirement of this part or for interference in the performance of the duty of the enforcement officer."



Store cooked and ready-to-eat food above raw food to avoid cross-contamination.

Keep all food covered to prevent contamination

MANUAL SANITIZING OF EQUIPMENT AND UTENSILS USING A THREE COMPARTMENT SINK

- 1. SCRAPE, clean, or soak items as necessary before washing.
- 2. WASH items in detergent and hot water of at least 100°F in the first sink.
- 3. RINSE items in clear water in the second sink
- 4. SANITIZE by submerging each item in a sanitizing solution in the third sink. Use one of the following sanitizing methods:
 - \bullet 100ppm of a chlorine based sanitizer for a minimum of 30 seconds in the solution
 - 200ppm of a quaternary ammonium based sanitizer for a minimum of 60 seconds in the solution
 - 25ppm of an iodine based sanitizer for a minimum of 60 seconds in the solution
 - Water at a temperature of 171°F for a minimum of 30 seconds in solution

5. AIR DRY all items on the drain board.



PROPER COOLING OF FOOD IN YOUR FACILITY

Potentially hazardous foods should always be rapodly cooled.

TIME IS THE KEY FACTOR IN PROPER COOLING

- Foods must cool from 135°F to 70°F in 2 hours or less
- Foods must cool from 70°F to 41°F in 4 hours or less

Use one of the following methods to cool food properly:

- Break large foods down into smaller portions and place in shallow pans no more than 4 inches deep. Metal pans cool better than glass or plastic pans.
- Add ice as an ingredient to replace water used in the recipe.
- Place foods within an ice bath and frequently stir the foods to speed the cooling process.
- · Loosely cover foods so that heat and steam can escape during cooling.
- Arrange containers within a refrigeration unit so that air can flow properly around containers.
- Use special equipment like chill paddles or blast chillers to rapidly bring down food temperature.

Use an accurate thermometer to verify the food is being cooled within proper timeframes

PROPER FOOD THAWING METHODS

- Under refrigeration
- In a microwave oven on "defrost"
 - Submerged under cold running water in an approved preparation sink for no longer than 2 hours
 - As part of the cooking process



INTERNAL COOKING TEMPERATURES

Use a probe thermometer to take internal cooking temperatures



Food temperature cannot be felt - use your probe thermometer!
