Inspector Comments: All food contact surfaces shall be properly washed, rinsed, sanitized, and air dried. Observed an accumulation of encrusted food debris on griddle at cook line. Properly clean and sanitize equipment.

Violation Description: All food contact surfaces of utensils and equipment shall be properly cleaned and sanitized. Food contact surfaces shall be clean to the sight and touch, no accumulation of dust, dirt, food residue, and other debris. Observed an accumulation of live adult and nymph cockroaches on walls and floors below mop sink, 3-compartment sink and food preparation sink. Eliminate cockroaches and all evidence of cockroaches in a sage and legal manner.

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of vermin. Only approved animals, such as service animals or decorative fish in aquariums, are permitted inside a food facility. (114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

- 2) Black substances on ice inside ice machine. Ensure ice is protected from contamination.

Clean and maintain equipment.

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44. PREMISES; PERSONAL ITEM STORAGE AND CLEANING ITEM STORAGE

Inspector Comments: Store all personal items in lockers or other approved designated area. Observed employee keys on tray at food preparation table near cook line. Properly store personal items away from food and food contact surfaces to prevent contamination.

Violation Description: Lockers or another approved area for personal belongings shall be provided. The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and items that are unnecessary to the operation or maintenance of the facility. At least one janitorial sink with hot and cold running water shall be provided. Cleaning supplies and equipment shall be stored separate from food and food-related areas. Mops shall be stored in such a way that allows air-drying. (114123, 114256, 114256.1, 114256.2, 114256.4, 114279, 114281, 114282)

45. FLOORS, WALLS, CEILING: GOOD REPAIR / FULLY ENCLOSED

Inspector Comments: The floors, walls, ceilings of a food facility shall be an approved type, have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, and washable surfaces, and shall be maintained in good repair. Observed the following:

- 1) Damaged door frame at kitchen entrance.
- 2) Loose base cove tiles near ice machine.

Repair/replace damaged walls and base coving.

Violation Description: The floors, walls, ceilings finishes must be of an approved material, durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, and easily cleanable. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. (114143 (d), 114257, 114266, 114268, 114271, 114272)

46. FLOORS, WALLS, AND CEILINGS: CLEAN

Inspector Comments: The floors, walls, ceilings of a food facility shall be maintained clean. Observed an accumulation of dirt and food debris on floors below equipment throughout kitchen area. Properly move all equipment and clean floors.

Violation Description: Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be maintained clean. (114257, 114268.1)

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Overall Inspection Comments

At this time this facility had failed to meet the minimum requirements of the California Health and Safety Code (87 = B) and facility has been closed due to cockroach infestation. Owner has voluntarily closed and must contact our department to schedule a re-inspection prior to re-openeing the facility. Ensure violations listed on this report are corrected in order for facility to be re-opened and re-scored. "A" card removed, "B" sign posted. 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REASONS FOR IMMEDIATE CLOSURE OF A FOOD FACILITY

Per California Health and Safety Code Section 114409 (a):


"If any imminent health hazard is found, unless the hazard is immediately corrected, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed."

A food facility may be closed for any of the following reasons:

- · Overflowing sewage (inside or outside the facility)
- · No potable water
- · No hot water
- No electricity
- · Rodent or insect infestation
- · Any other conditions at the facility that may create an imminent public health risk

In addition to the reasons above, Per California Heath and Safety Code Section 114411:


"The enforcement agency may, after providing opportunity for a hearing, modify, suspend, or revoke a permit for serious or repeated violations of any requirement of this part or for interference in the performance of the duty of the enforcement officer.3



Keep all food covered to prevent contamination

MANUAL SANITIZING OF EQUIPMENT AND UTENSILS USING A THREE COMPARTMENT SINK

- 1. SCRAPE, clean, or soak items as necessary before washing.
- 2. WASH items in detergent and hot water of at least 100°F in the first sink.
- RINSE items in clear water in the second sink.
- 4. SANITIZE by submerging each item in a sanitizing solution in the third sink. Use one of the following sanitizing methods:
 - 100ppm of a chlorine based sanitizer for a minimum of 30 seconds in the solution
 - · 200ppm of a quaternary ammonium based sanitizer for a minimum of 60 seconds
 - · 25ppm of an iodine based sanitizer for a minimum of 60 seconds in the solution



PROPER COOLING OF FOOD IN YOUR FACILITY

Potentially hazardous foods should always be rapodly cooled.

TIME IS THE KEY FACTOR IN PROPER COOLING

- Foods must cool from 135°F to 70°F in 2 hours or less
- Foods must cool from 70°F to 41°F in 4 hours or less

Use one of the following methods to cool food properly:

- Break large foods down into smaller portions and place in shallow pans no more than 4 inches deep. Metal pans cool better than glass or plastic pans.
- Add ice as an ingredient to replace water used in the recipe.
- Place foods within an ice bath and frequently stir the foods to speed the cooling process
- Loosely cover foods so that heat and steam can escape during cooling.
- Arrange containers within a refrigeration unit so that air can flow properly around
- Use special equipment like chill paddles or blast chillers to rapidly bring down food temperature


Use an accurate thermometer to verify the food is being cooled within proper timeframes

PROPER FOOD THAWING METHODS


- Under refrigeration

- Submerged under cold running water in an approved preparation sink for no longer than 2 hours

Use a probe thermometer to take internal cooking temperatures
